

Settings Guide

Privacy Settings on Cell Phone:



When you take a picture with your phone, a geotag is added to each photograph which gives details of when and where the photo was taken. To turn off location on photos to avoid geotagging:

Go to Settings>Privacy>Location Services>Camera>Off

AND do this for all APPS

Instagram:



Go to settings:

“Photos of You” – manually approve

“Story Settings” – choose who can reply to your story

“Allow Sharing” – keep off

“Private Account” – turn on

“Comments” – hide offensive comments

Twitter:



Go to settings>Privacy and Safety

Set “Protect your tweets” – on

Set “Photo tagging” - only people you follow can tag you

Snapchat:



Go to Settings:

Select “Manage Who Can...” and change to “my friends” for each option listed

YouTube

Go to Profile Pic>Settings>set to restricted mode

Turn on safety mode. Be aware that YouTube is technically only for teens 13 and up, and what the site considers age-appropriate may not match your values. But YouTube offers a filter called Safety Mode that limits the iffy stuff. Simply scroll down to the bottom of any YouTube page. See where it says "Safety"? Click it on. (It will remain on for logged-in users on the same browser.
